

Roebuck Lake

LOCATION: East of Hwy. 7 at Itta Bena, MS.

SIZE: 400 acres.

DEPTH: Varies from 6 to 13 feet.

AQUATIC VEGETATION: None.

MAJOR SPORTFISH: Largemouth bass, crappie, bream (bluegill), channel catfish.

OTHER FISH: Bowfin, buffalo, common carp, drum, flathead catfish, green sunfish, gar.

FISH FORAGE: Shad, minnows, sunfish.

VISIBLE COVER: Cypress trees.

BOTTOM FEATURES: Logs and stumps.

ACCESS: The main boat ramp is located in a city park on the south side of town near Main Street. The ramp for lower Roebuck Lake is an unimproved dirt and gravel ramp.

DESCRIPTION: Roebuck Lake is an ancient remnant of the Ohio River. Roebuck Lake is separated into two lakes by a wier on the lower end. The lake is suitable for water skiing in the wider sections.
