

Sardis Lake

LOCATION: Sardis Lake is located in Panola, Lafayette, and Marshall counties. The dam site is located 9 miles southeast of the town of Sardis on Scenic Loop 315.

SIZE: The permanent pool is approximately 9,800 acres and the flood control pool is approximately 58,500 acres.

DEPTH: Depth varies with reservoir stage.

AQUATIC VEGETATION: None.

MAJOR SPORTFISH: Crappie, catfish, white bass, striped bass, bream, and largemouth bass.

OTHER FISH: Bowfin, buffalo, common carp, drum, flathead catfish, green sunfish, gar.

FISH FORAGE: Shad, minnows, sunfish.

VISIBLE COVER: Willow flats, buttonbush, cypress trees, rip-rap.

BOTTOM FEATURES: Dropoffs, man-made fish structures, sandbars, creek channels.

MAN-MADE FISH STRUCTURES:

These structures were placed by U.S. Army Corps of Engineers personnel under the guidance of staff biologists. The structures consist of brush shelters which are placed in groups of 100-200 shelters per area. (See map)

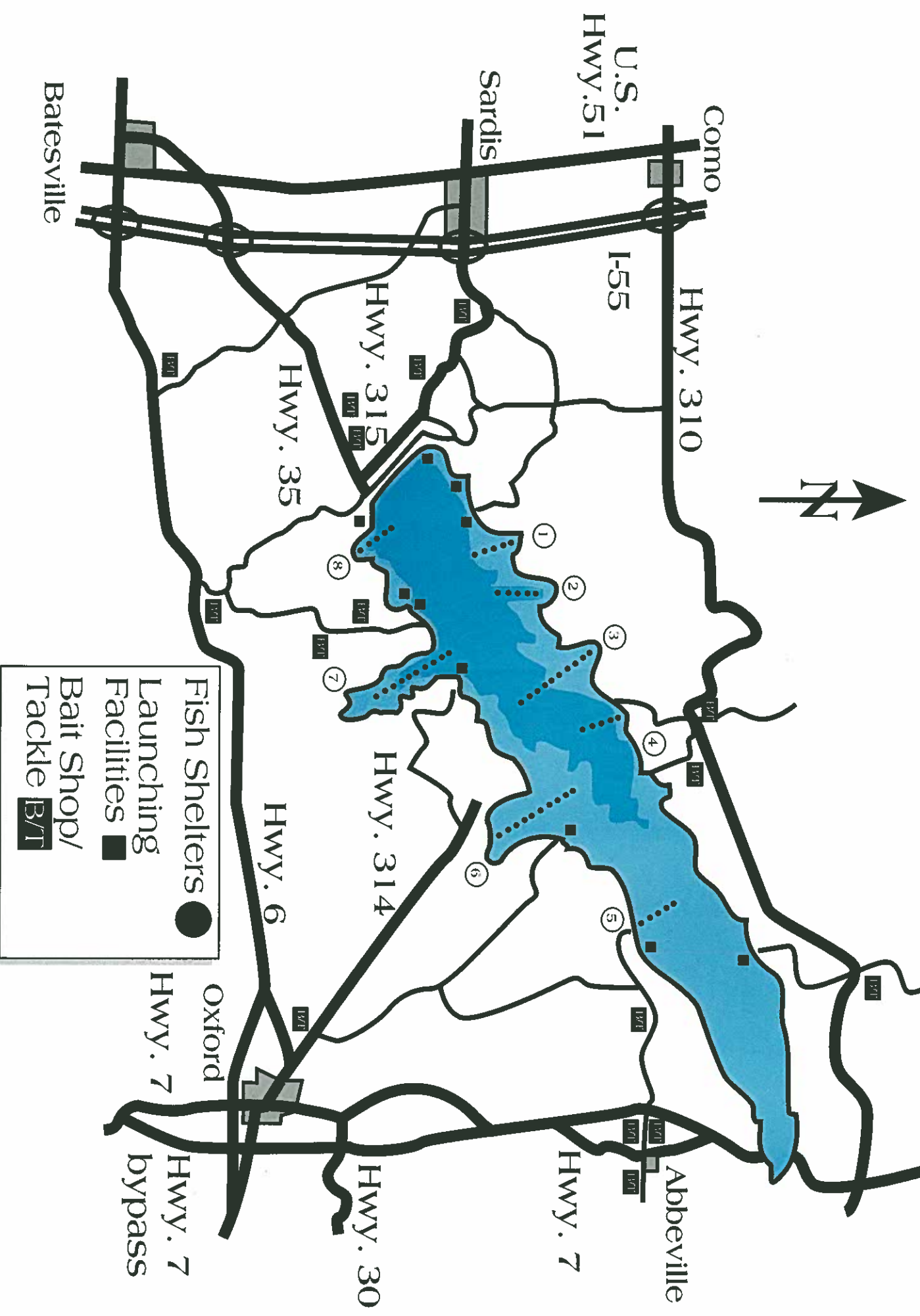
